VP Corner

For our January 2015 meeting we are very fortunate to have Mike Ostrander as our guest speaker. Most or you will know him as Capt. Mike who runs boat tours on the James to view eagles and other wildlife along the river. Mike is going to share with us the experiences he had discovering the historic James via a canoe trip he took this past year starting at the headwaters and following the course of the river. He also will talk about bald eagles, osprey and sturgeon on the river.



Trained in 1997 by the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries as an Angling Instructor, Capt. Mike now operates Discover the James and the James River Fishing School. In 2001 he attained his USCG Captain's License to include the tidal James, and in 2012 achieved his Master's Captain's license and is also currently the Captain of the James River Association's "Spirit of the James", a 40 foot educational pontoon boat located at Jordan Point in Hopewell, VA.

He is a recipient of the "Steward of the James" award, presented by the James River Advisory Council, and named a "River Hero" by the Friends of James River Park. 


